# Hospital Services

- Management of acutely mentally ill requiring crisis stabilization and at times medical management of same patients
- Danger of Injury to Self or Others or unable to care for self
- Strict admission criteria
  - Mental Health Code
  - CMS Conditions of Participation
  - Managed Care Admission Criteria
- Hospital not for SPMI

# Key Hospital Services

- Intake and Assessment
  - Emergency Department
  - Scheduled Appointments
- Inpatient Psychiatric Admission primarily stabilization
- Partial Hospitalization Program
- Intensive Outpatient Program
- Traditional Counseling (limited)

# Key Barriers to Treatment

## Financial Coverage

- Medicare and Medicaid Payments
- Managed Care Policies and Payments
- Uninsured and Underinsured
- ACCESS DuPage

## Access

- Availability of Providers especially psychiatrists willing to take Medicaid OPMH
- Availability of Treatment Programs
- Limited State Operated Facilities for SPMI/reduction in state operated beds
- Limited resources for mentally ill substance abusers

# Challenges for Hospitals

- Emergency Department Visits Increasing
- Emergency Department Delays
- SASS and SASSAR and CHIPS
- Lack of Discharge Treatment Options
  - State Operated Beds
  - Outpatient Providers
  - Place for patients to live

# DuPage Psychiatric Providers

- Good Sam – 35 staffed beds, Adults and Older Adult Programs
- Central DuPage – 15 staffed beds, Adolescent and Adult Programs
- Glen Oaks – 58 staffed beds, Adolescent and Adult Programs
- Hinsdale – 17 staffed beds, Adolescent, Adult and Older Adult Programs
- Elmhurst Hospital – 18 staffed beds, Adolescent and Adult
- Edward-Linden Oaks Hospital – 96 Staffed beds, Child, Adolescent, Adult, Gero

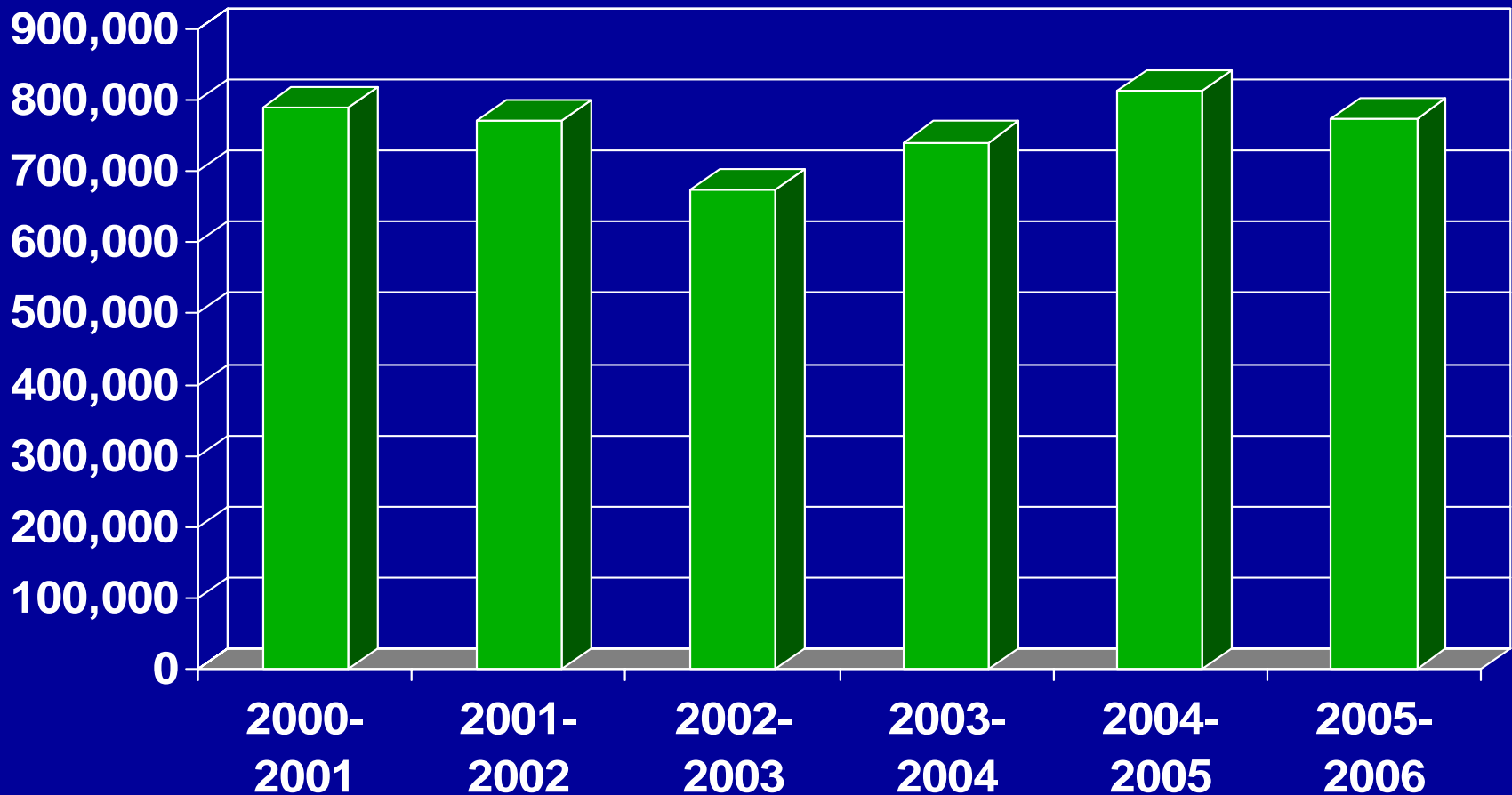
# Other Providers

- Mercy – 77 staffed beds, Child, Adolescent, Adult and Older Adults Programs St. Joseph – 33 staffed beds, Adult Program
- Silver Cross – 20 staffed beds, Adult Program
- Rush Copley Hospital -- No Beds
- Bolingbrook Hospital -- No Beds
- Delnor – No Beds
- Alexian Brothers – |Approximately 130 beds
- Streamwood – Approximately 80 beds, only children and adolescents

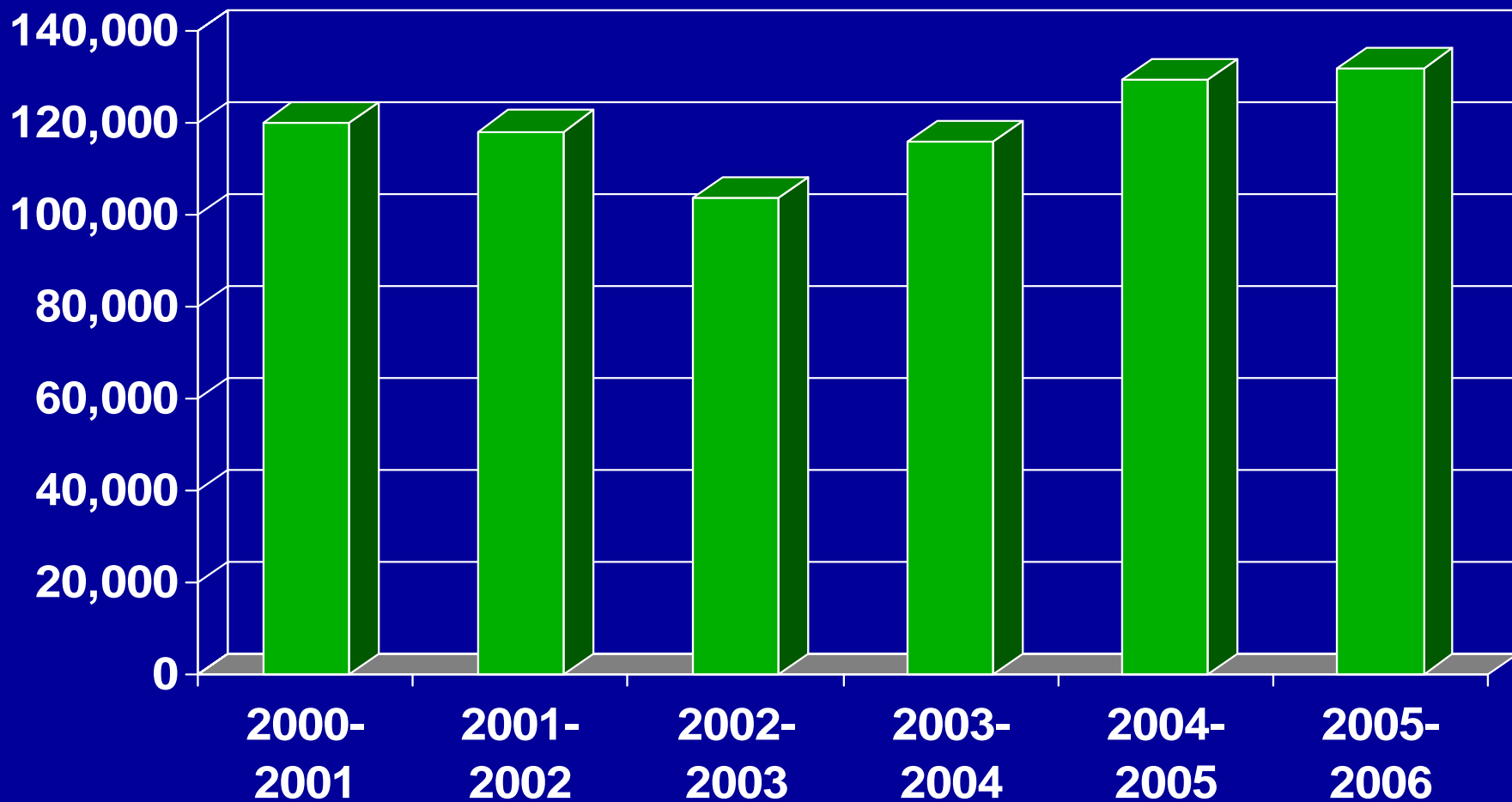
# Gaps In Service between Hospital and Community Services

- Housing

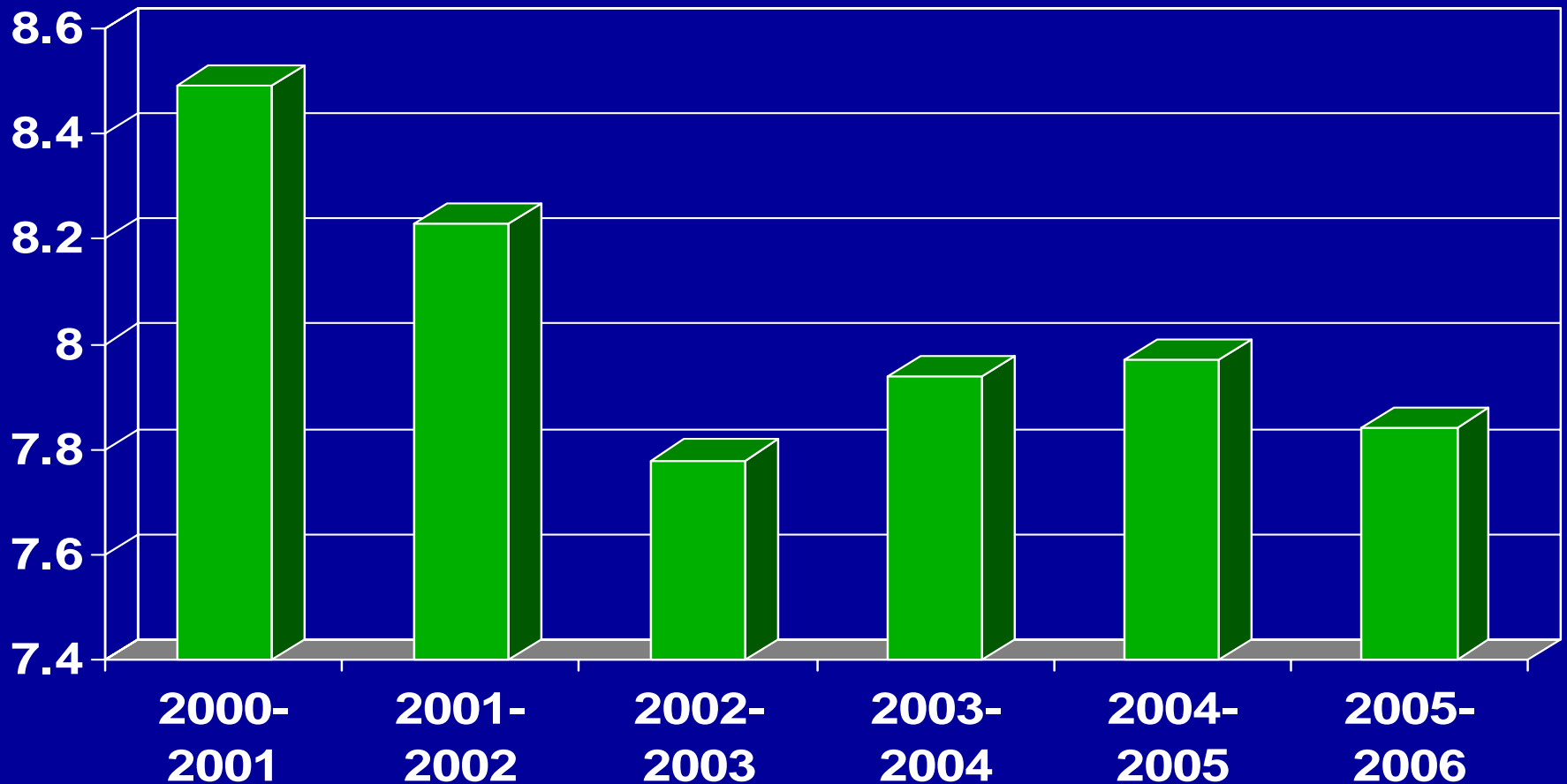
# Total Days for Inpatient Psychiatric Services per State Fiscal Year (Adult & Children)



# Total Days for Substance Abuse Services per State Fiscal Year (Adult & Children)

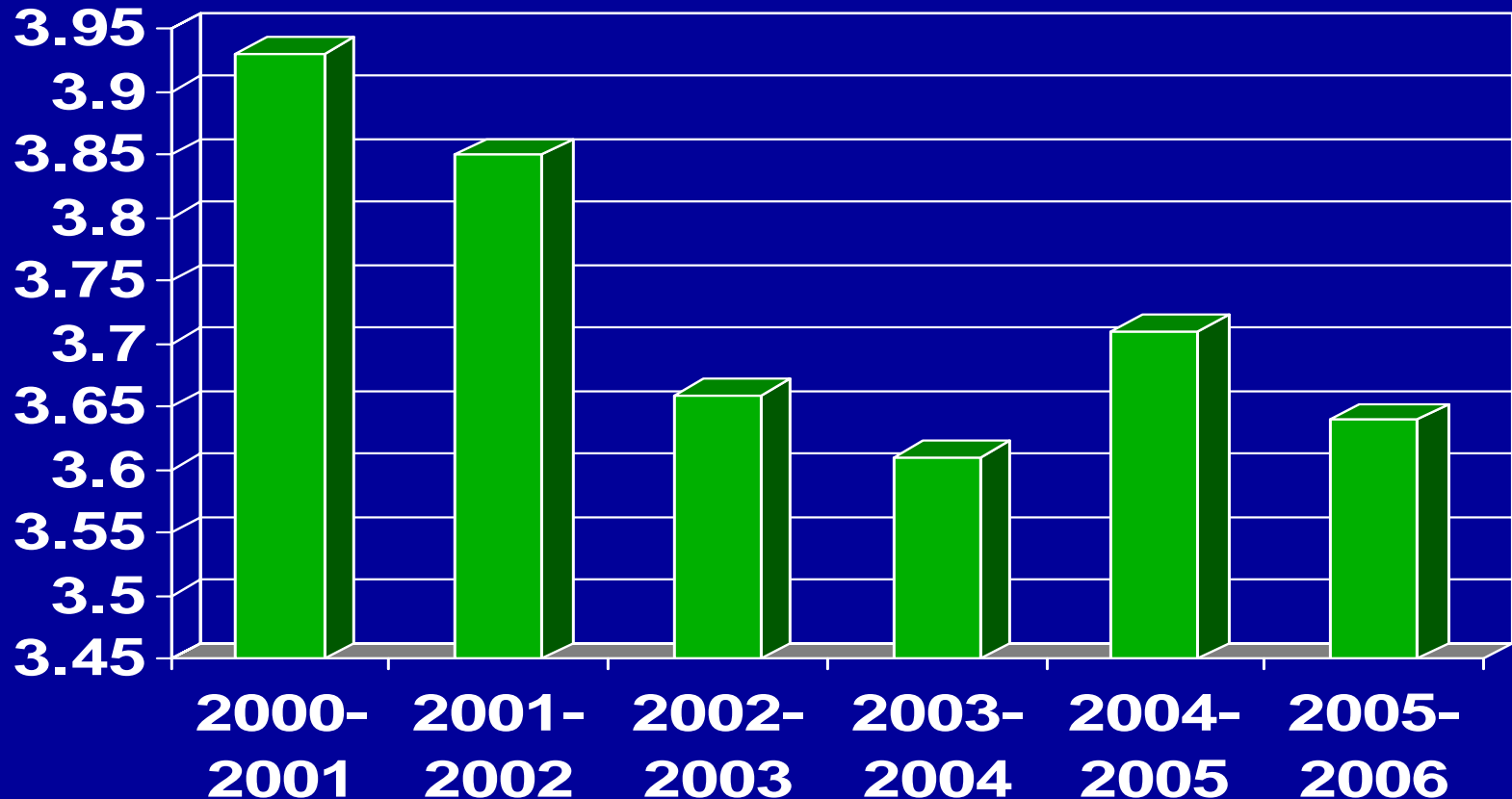


# Average Length of Stay (ALOS) of Inpatient Psychiatric Services by State Fiscal Year



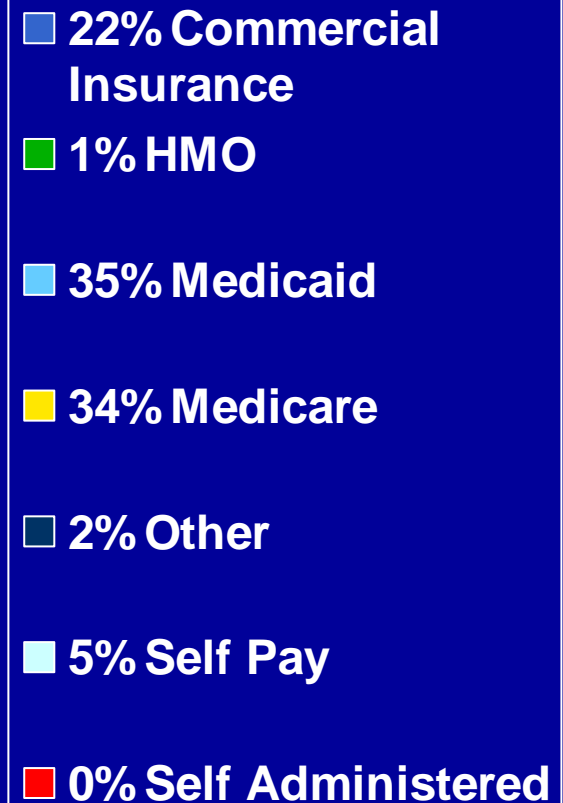
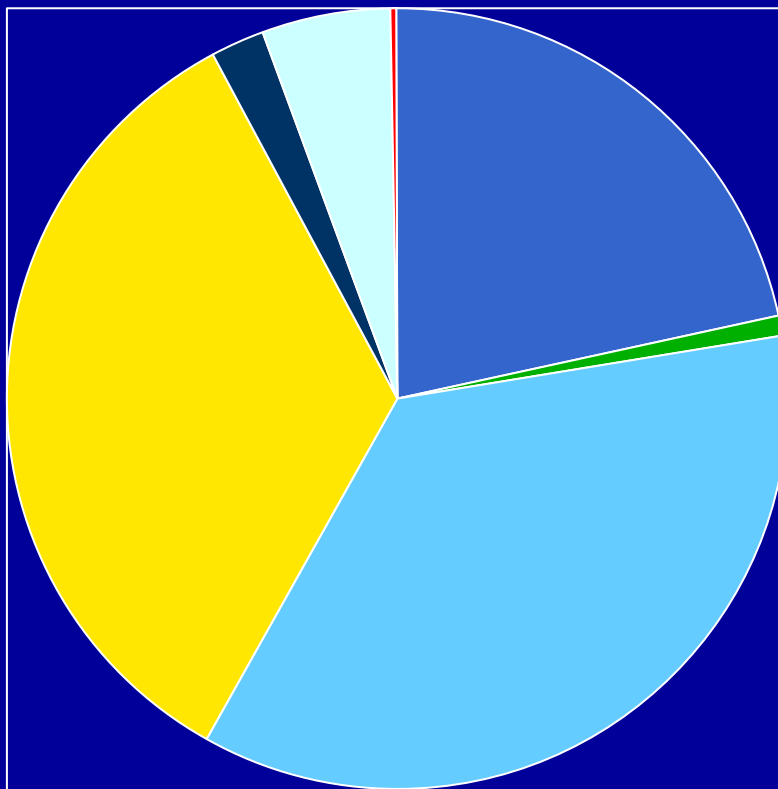

# Average Length of Stay (ALOS) of Substance Abuse Services by State Fiscal Year

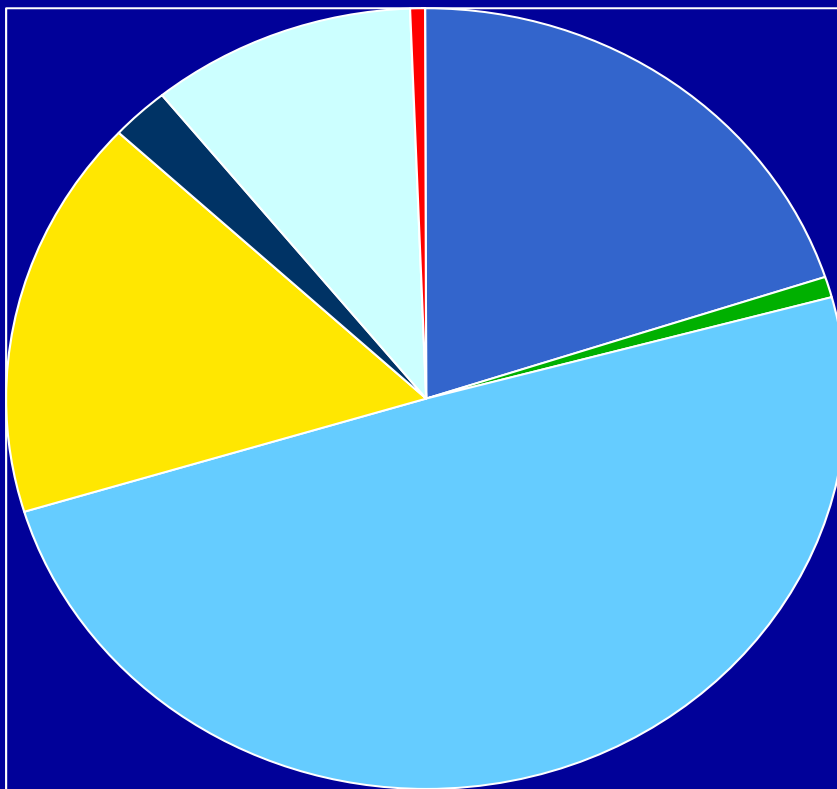

# SFY 2005-2006 Adult (18 & Over) Inpatient Psychiatric Cases by Payor

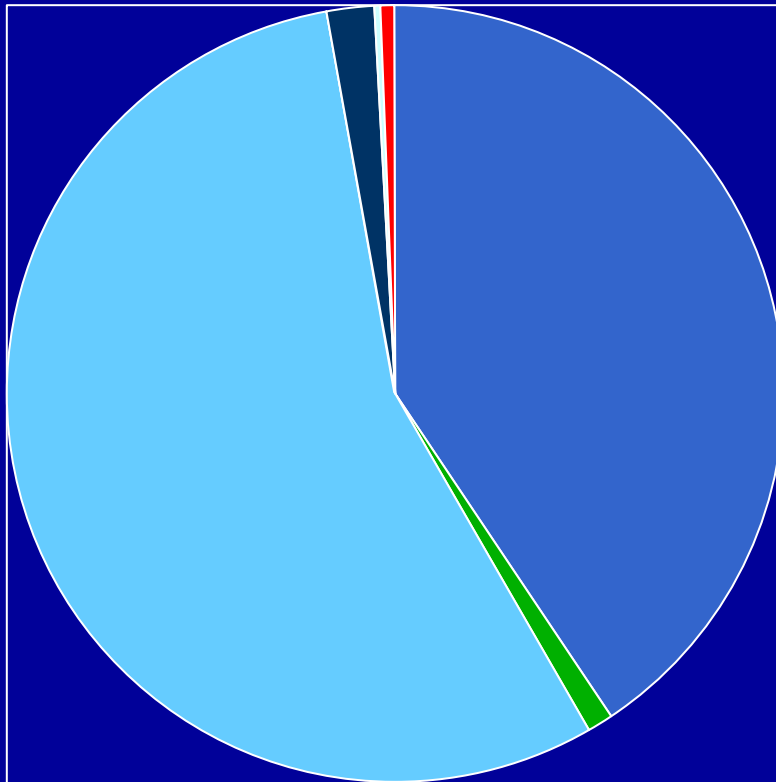


# SFY 2005-2006 Adult (18 & Over) Substance Abuse Cases by Payor



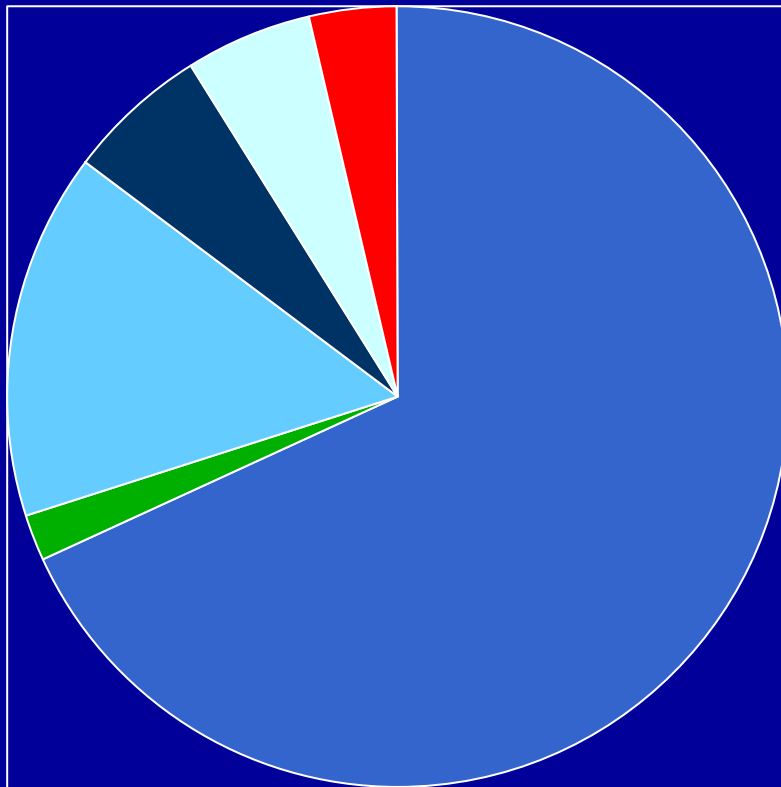

# SFY 2005-2006 Children (17 & Under) Inpatient Psychiatric Cases by Payor



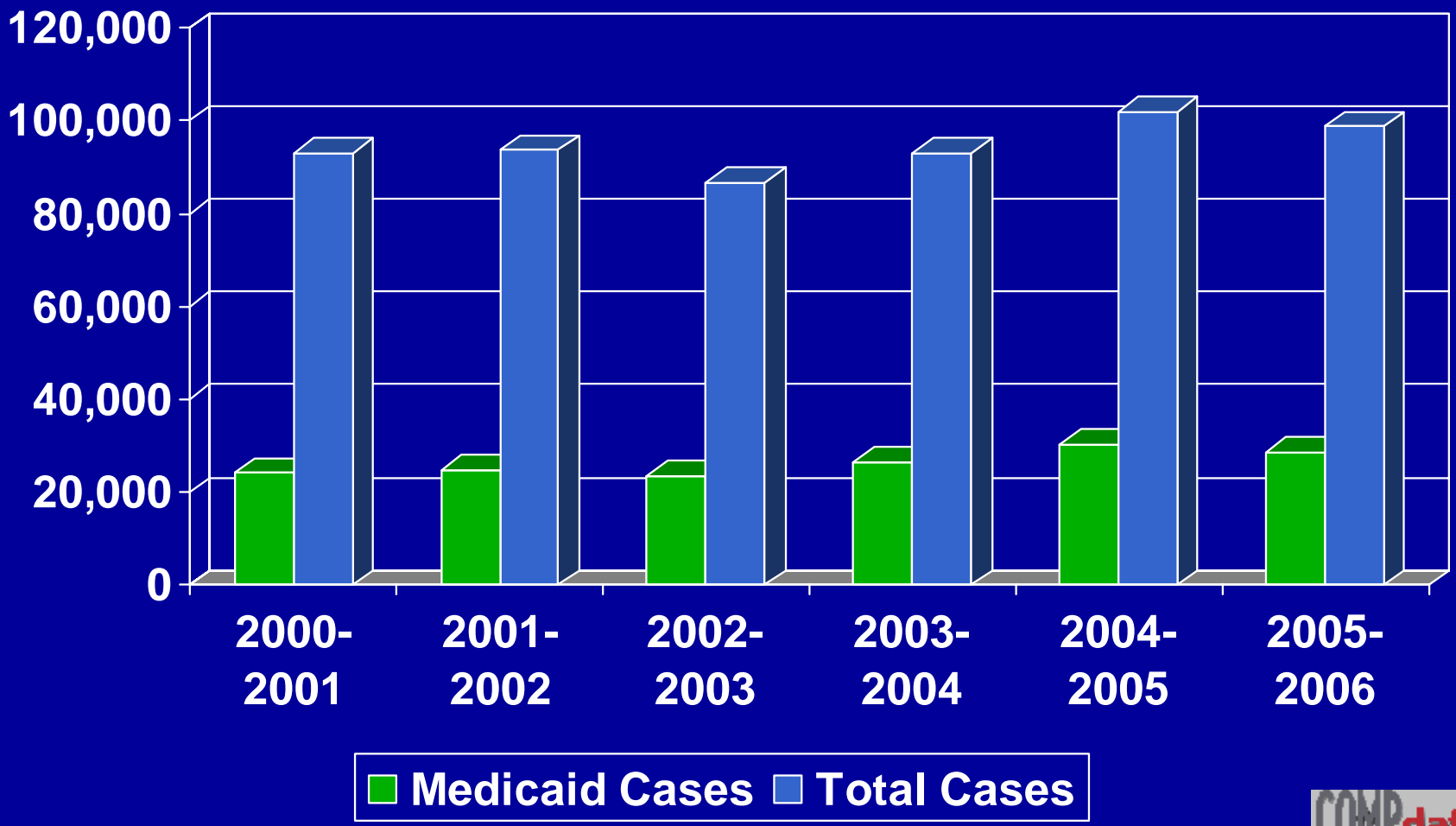

# SFY 2005-2006 Children (17 & Under) Substance Abuse Cases by Payor

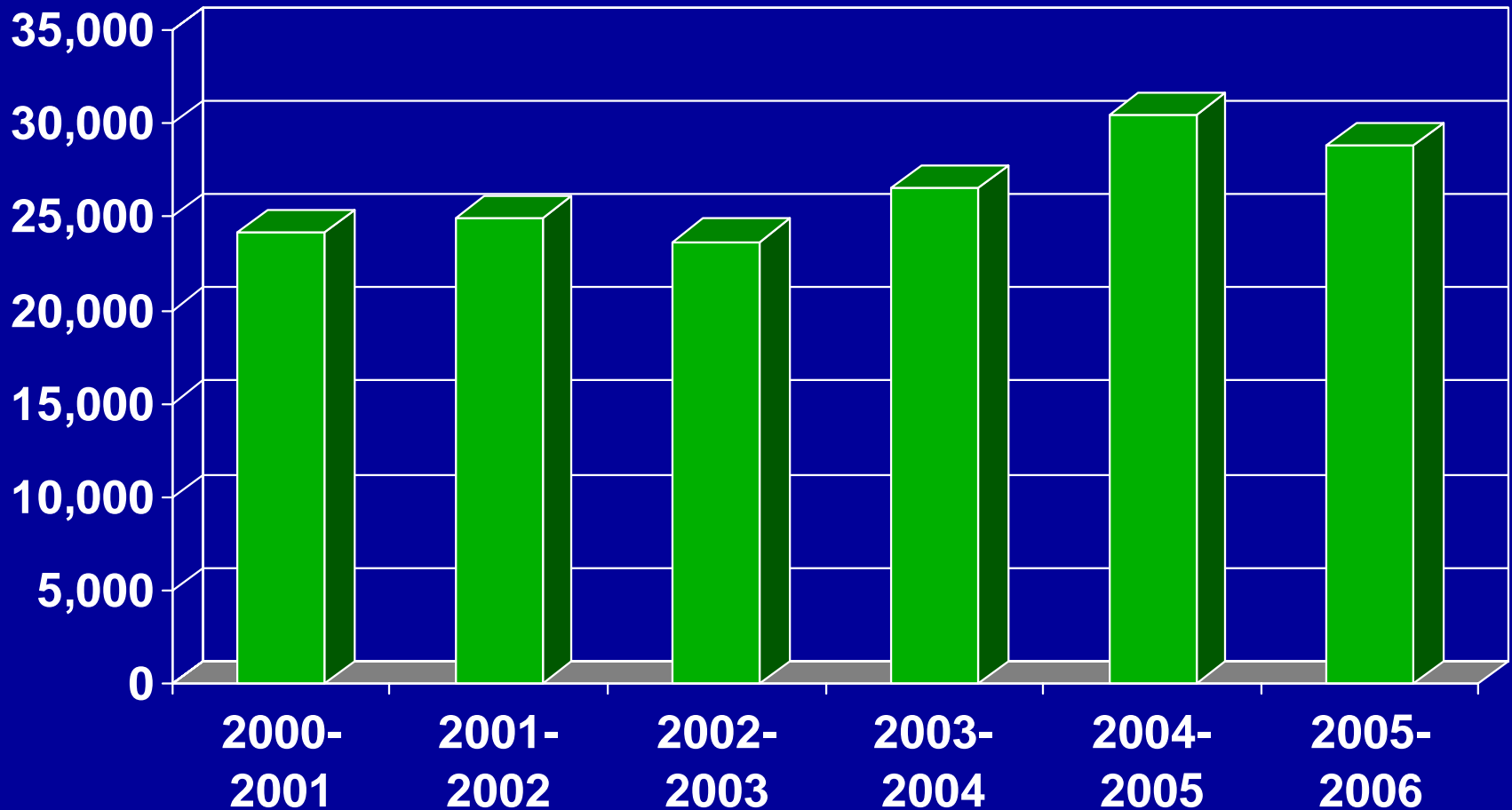

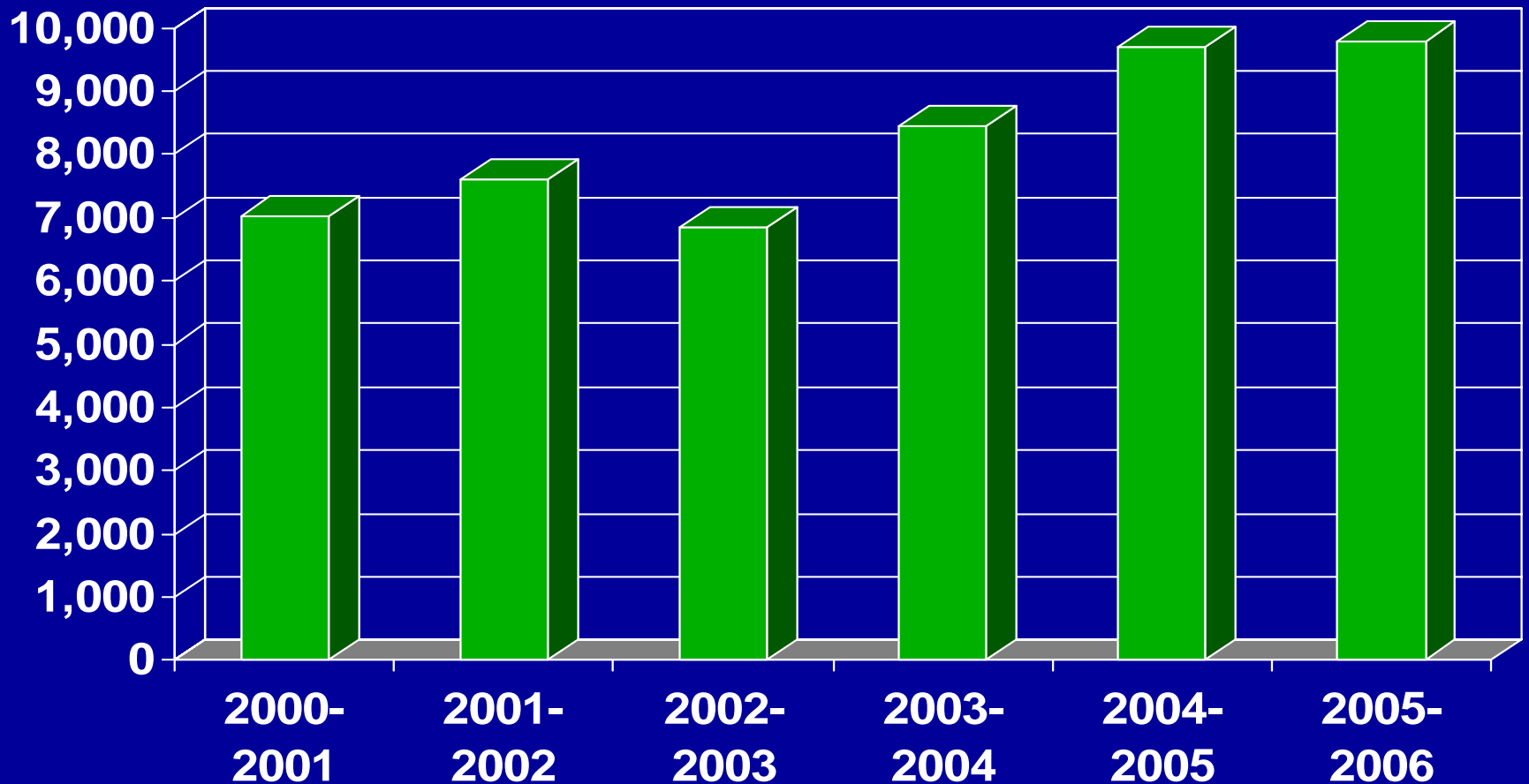
# Adult (18 & Over) Inpatient Psychiatric Medicaid Cases by State Fiscal Year



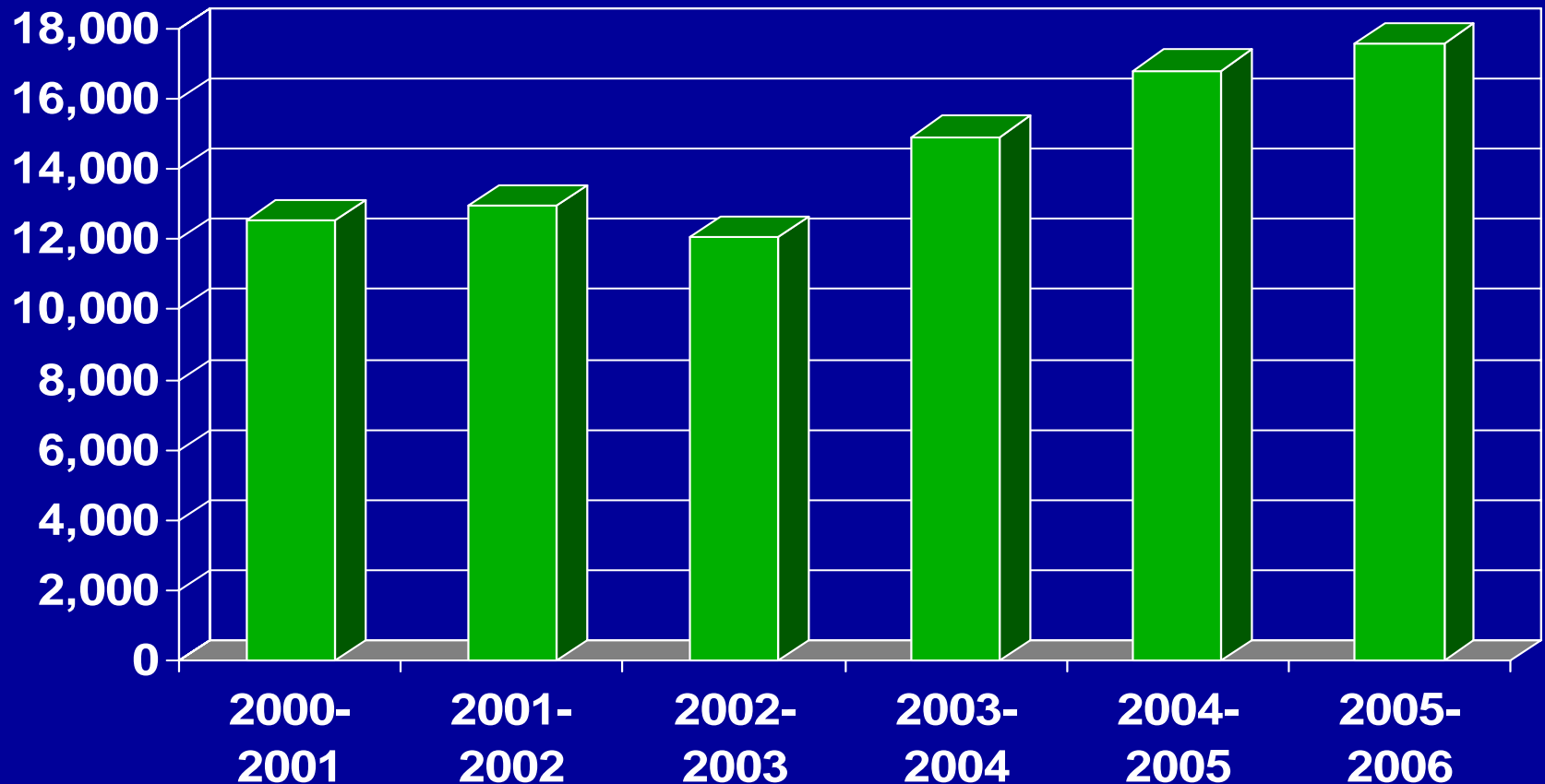
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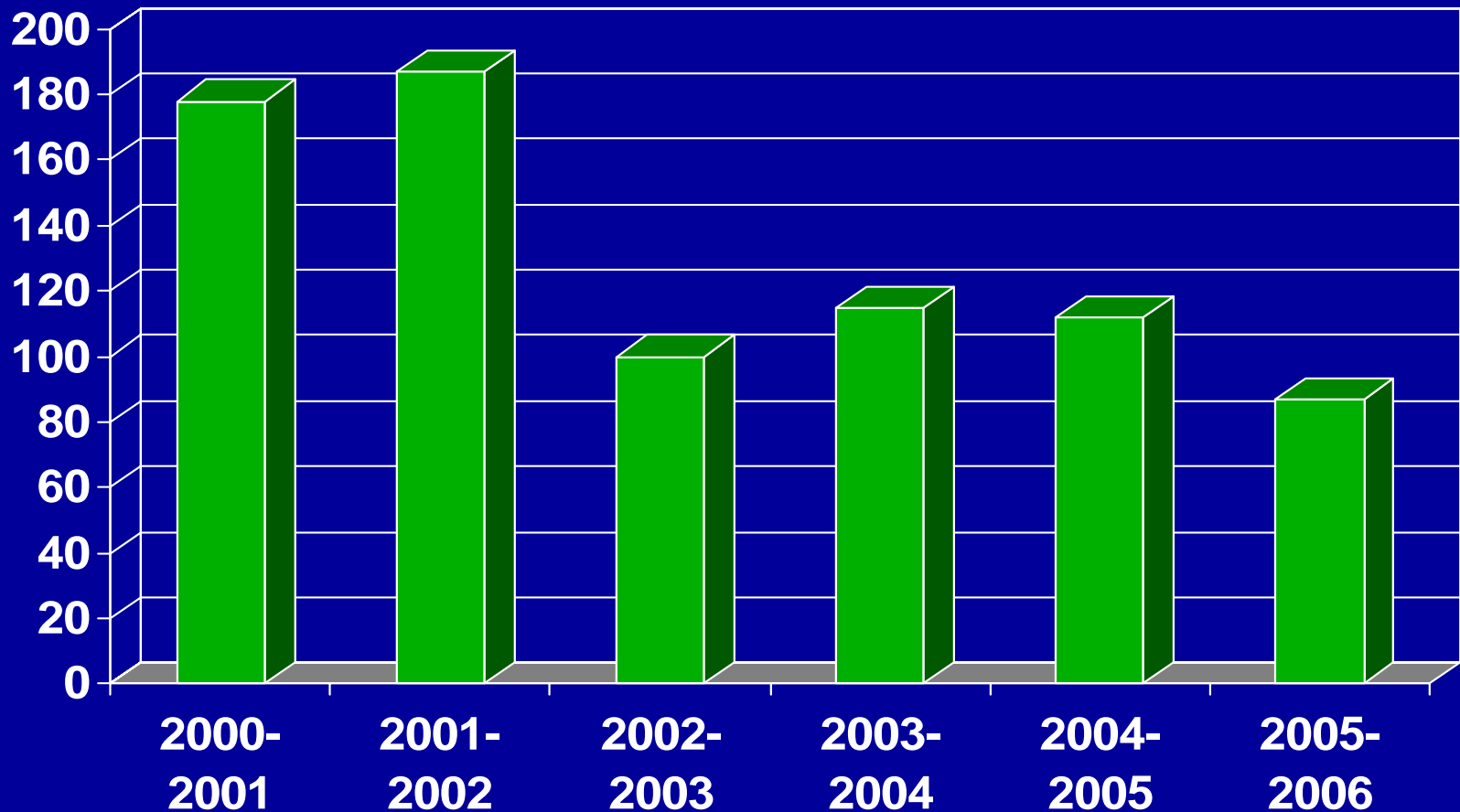
# Children (17 & Under) Inpatient Psychiatric Medicaid Cases by State Fiscal Year



# Adult (18 & Over) Substance Abuse Medicaid Cases by State Fiscal Year

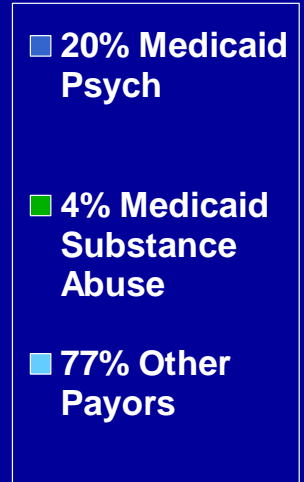
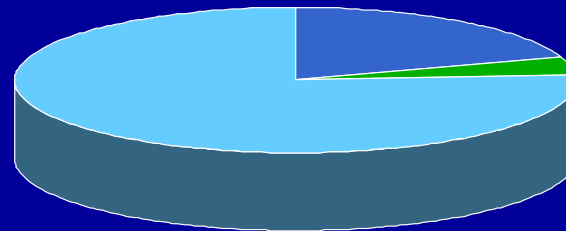


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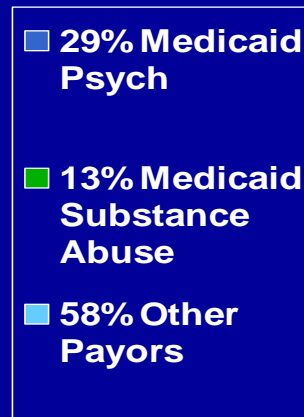
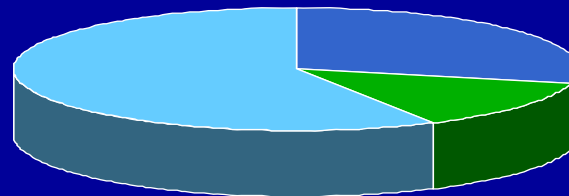

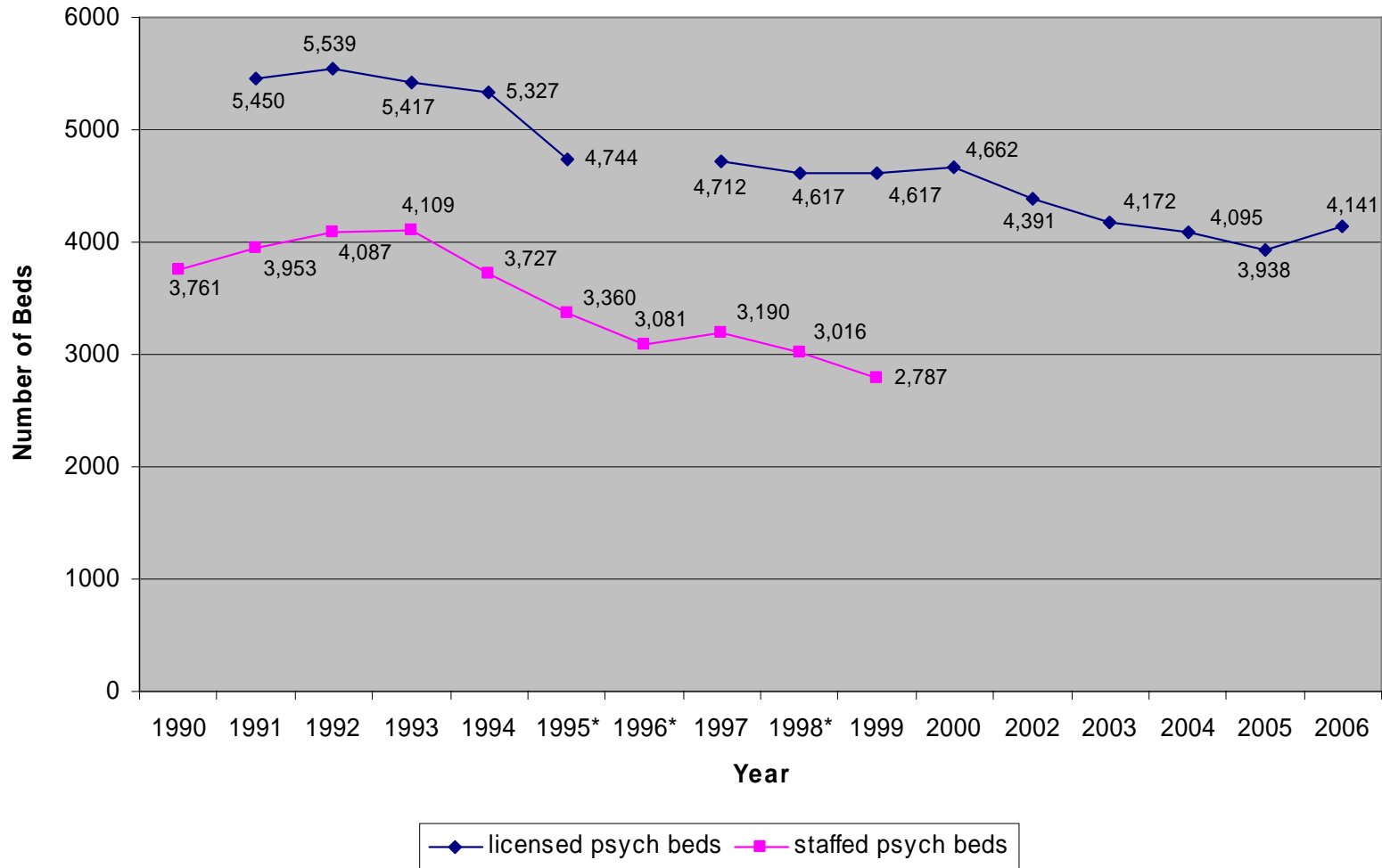
**FY 1993 – All Payors

Substance Abuse Cases**



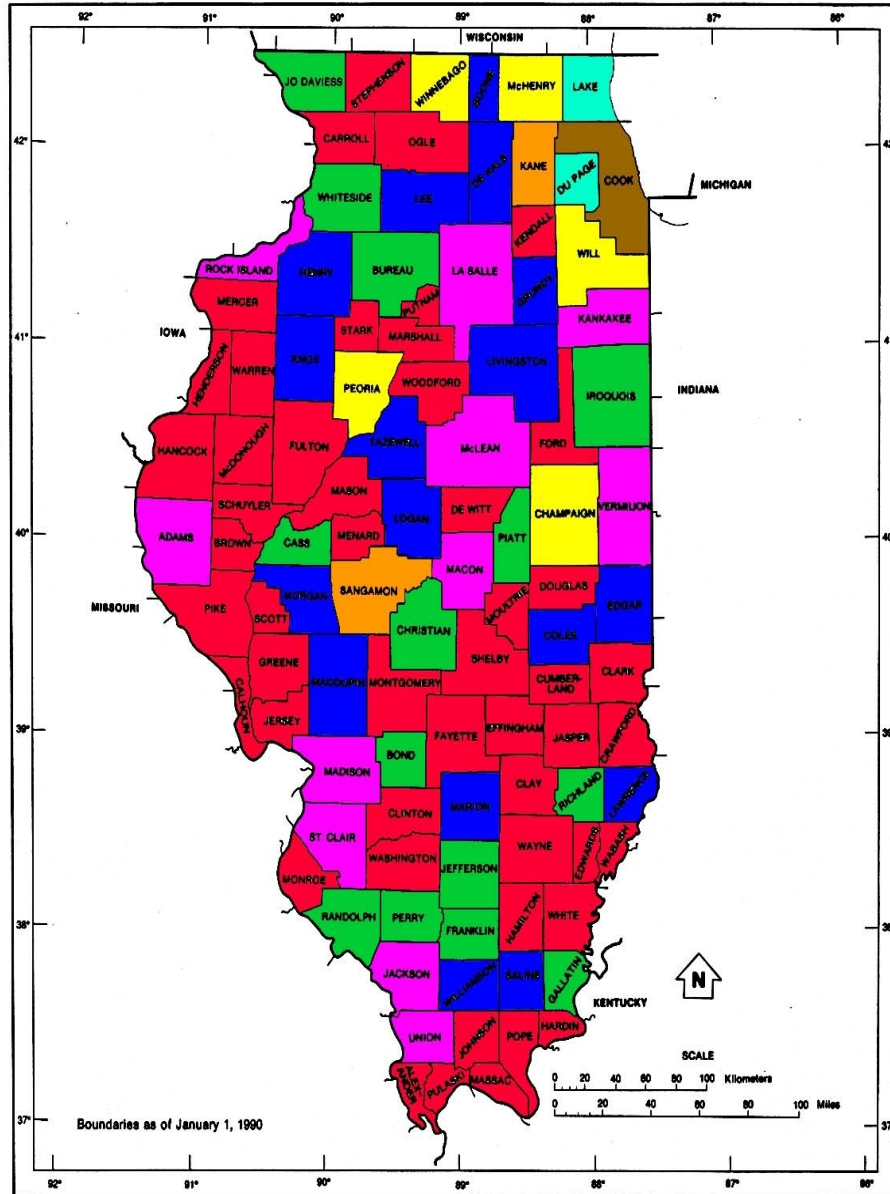
**FY 2005 – All Payors

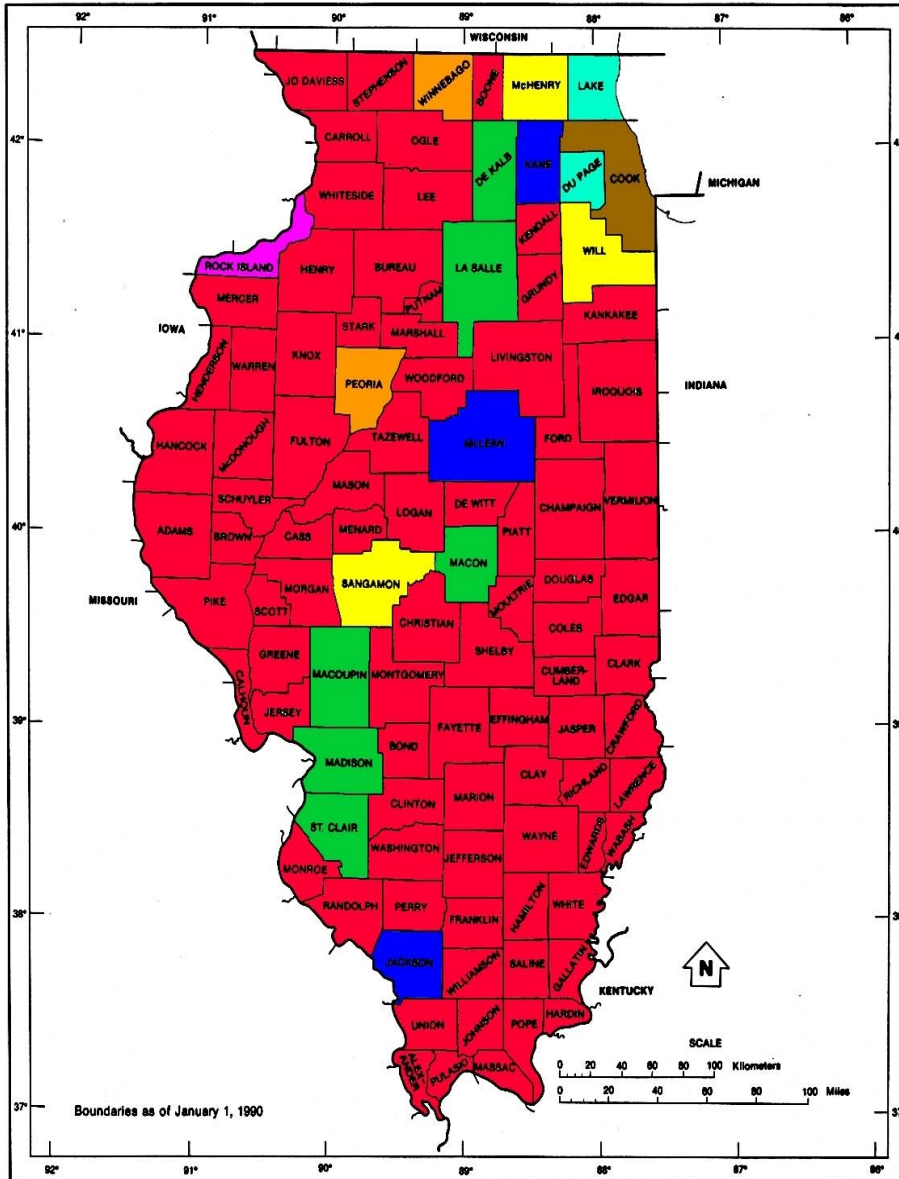
