

- Evaluate the equitable distribution of testing, treatment, prevention measures and other resources; and evaluate measures to improve access for underserved groups

DuPage County Monkeypox Case Summary as of 9/7/2022

- Confirmed/Probable Cases:
 - Total = 19 (10 confirmed; 9 probable)
 - \circ **Sex** = 19 male (100%)
 - Average age: 30 years (range: 18-48 years)
 - Race: 12 White (63.2%), 4 Black/African American (21.1%), 2 Asian (10.5%) 1 Two or More Races (5.3%)
 - Ethnicity: 12 non-Hispanic or Latino (63.2%), 7 Hispanic or Latino (36.8%)
 - HIV status: 4 positive (21.1%), 5 negative (26.3%), 10 unknown (52.6%)
 - Specimen collection date range: 6/7/2022-8/24/2022

DuPage County Monkeypox Case Summary as of 9/7/2022 (continued)

- Confirmed/Probable Cases:
 - Total = 19 (10 confirmed; 9 probable)
 - Antiviral treatment (TPOXX) received: 3 (15.8%)
 - Treatment by Race: 1 white, 1 black or African American, and 1 Two or More Races
 - Treatment by Ethnicity: 2 Not Hispanic or Latino, 1 Hispanic or Latino
 - Hospitalization status: 1 (5.3%)

DuPage County Monkeypox Case Summary as of 9/7/2022 (continued)

- Potential exposures:
 - Travel: 4 (21.1%) 1 domestic/large gatherings, also reported MSM; 1 international/MSM; 2 domestic/MSM/reported contact with a case
 - Large Gatherings/Pride: 1 (5.3%); also reported MSM w/ spouse
 - Large Gatherings/non-Pride-related: 1 (5.3%); reported local community festivals/fairs, amusement park
 - MSM only: 5 (26.3%)
 - Other: 2 (10.5%); 1 reported only heterosexual contact and visiting a gym; 1 reported no exposures besides working at a gas station
 - Unknown: 6 (31.6%) 4 not interviewed; 1 refused to provide information: 1 reported no exposures/no recent sexual contact and did not provide sexual orientation information.

DuPage County Monkeypox Contacts Summary as of 9/7/2022

- 55 DuPage County resident contacts
 - No Risk (monitoring not required) = 3 (healthcare)
 - Low/Uncertain Risk = 21 (1 community; 20 healthcare)
 - Monitoring period ongoing = 1
 - High/Intermediate Risk = 31 (13 community; 18 healthcare)
 - Monitoring period ongoing = 2
 - Total high/intermediate contacts receiving PEP/vaccination = 15 (8 community;
 7 healthcare)
- 54 healthcare facility exposures needing follow-up (across 22 facilities)
 - 86 associated health care worker contacts in DuPage County facilities (29 high/intermediate risk)
 - Monitoring period ongoing = 8
 - Total high/intermediate contacts receiving PEP/vaccination = 4



STD Facts – What Gay, Bisexual and Other Men Who Have Sex with Men Need to Know About Sexually Transmitted Diseases

CDC recommends sexually active gay and bisexual men get tested for:

- **HIV** at least once a year;
- Syphilis;
- Hepatitis B;
- Hepatitis C based on risk factors;
- Chlamydia and gonorrhea of the rectum if you've had receptive anal sex (been a "bottom") in the past year;
- Chlamydia and gonorrhea of the penis if you have had insertive anal sex (been a "top") or received oral sex in the past year;
- Gonorrhea of the throat if you've performed oral sex (i.e., your mouth on your partner's pervagina, or anus) in the past year;
- Sometimes, your healthcare provider may suggest a herpes test.
