Federal Poverty Level

The Federal Poverty Level (FPL) is issued every year by the Department of Health and Human Services and is a measure of income. The different levels are used to determine your eligibility for certain programs and benefits. Each program may use a different percentage of the FPL to determine if you qualify for that program's benefit. The FPL rates are adjusted each year. The following chart lists the income level for different percentages of the FPL. These figures are current as of 2016.
