Do You Need Help Understanding the SNAP ABAWD Work Requirements?

Work requirements begin January of 2018 if you are an Able Bodied Adult without Dependents (ABAWDs) who lives in DuPage County and receive SNAP benefits.

There are Community Organizations that can help. The following is a sample of the DuPage County organizations that may be able to help:

- Explain the new rules
- Find work, training program or community service hours
- Determine if you meet an exemption
- Answer questions.

If you already receive services from a community organization, ask if they offer employment or training programs.

Illinois WorkNet Centers provide job search and training services. You can count 20 hours a week in services received at a WorkNet site. In DuPage County, contact:
